**Hello and Welcome to this Newsletter.** This is the best way to keep in touch with your parish during this time of shutdown and lockdown. We have one newsletter for all our churches and parishes. We hope that all our parishioners and their families are keeping well.

Isn't it Great to have Sunday Mass again? This is the third Sunday for us and it is such a joy for your priest to celebrate Mass with a congregation and a joy for each and every one to come again to Mass, and for those who are able, to receive the Lord in Holy Communion after the imposed "Eucharistic Fast" of four and a half months. So far, everyone has been kept safe as we obey all the rules, there has been room for everyone in church and nobody had to be turned away.

We are getting more relaxed, although the atmosphere is different to usual. Social distancing, no congregational singing, no sign of peace, no precious blood for the congregation, leaving church straight after Holy Communion. Face-coverings make us feel uncomfortable but keep us all safe. Our Stewards are a God-send: we need them every time we open church: baptisms, weddings, funerals, Confessions etc, etc: we have a good team, but require more: please see Fr Michael if you would like to help (dropping him an email is the best way).

It was great to see people form Oundle and Raunds at the Thrapston Masses and people from Kettering at Mass in Corby.

All in all, our first Masses went well. Please spread the word, the Good News that Mass is back!

We are now able to offer funerals in Our Lady's, St Paul's and St John Ogilvie's churches. The legal limit is set at 30 mourners in church. Very soon we will celebrate our first baptisms in church (limit of 10 guests), on Saturday mornings, to enable the church to be cleaned afterwards.

**First Holy Communion and Confirmation.** We are giving thought as to how we are going to be able to celebrate these occasions amidst all the restrictions. We may have to be imaginative and break with the traditional ways. Your ideas would be welcomed. Please watch this space.

**Happy holidays**. If you are heading off yourselves, we wish you the same. Come back safe and sound and tell us all about it.

**Canon Michael writes**: "Thank you for all the kind cards, gifts, Masses, prayers and good wishes upon the occasion of my 60<sup>th</sup> Birthday tomorrow, 17<sup>th</sup> August. There is something about being 60 and having been born in '60. Sorry that the parish "do" has to be cancelled (something to do with a virus?). But never mind. I will just have to stay in my 50's for a little longer! See you in a couple of weeks when I come back from seeing my family and taking some annual leave.

## Rules, Rules Rules. (A Reminder from last week, but there are New Rules too.)

Our Celebration of Mass is affected by pages and pages and pages of government restrictions and guidelines from the Church. Your patience is appreciated.

**Face coverings are compulsory for everyone in church,** including Altar Servers. The only exceptions are those who legally do not need to (including young children), the celebrant, the reader when reading and the cantor when singing. New rules say that the priest must don his mask when he gives out Holy Communion; please remove yours briefly before you receive.

All the current requirements of social distance must be maintained. Please sit only in the marked seats (with one metre space between you, unless you are a household group).

Sanitise hands upon entry and exit; please give contact details for "Track and Trace" purposes (these are retained confidentially for 21 days and are then destroyed in line with GDPR rules. Please do not move around in church, and follow the one-way system.

No congregational singing in church, cantor solos and background music only.

**Holy Communion** will be distributed immediately after the final blessing. Holy Communion is to be received on the hand only, not the tongue which the Church has forbidden. Please hold your hand up high, one on top of the other, with your arms fully extended (a barrier will be in place to prevent us getting too close). The host will be given to you in silence, please do not say "Amen" (we will say a communal "Amen" earlier in Mass).

The idea is that you receive Holy Communion and then exit the church. If you wish to say a prayer of thanksgiving, please use the church grounds (in Our Lady's the garden is available, accessible from the rear car park). Don't go home without greeting each other (from a safe distance), an essential element of communal worship, especially important during these isolated times.

Sadly the public toilet is "out of bounds".

Please be assured that the church is thoroughly cleaned before and after use.

Sorry to harp on about these restrictions, but we are not allowed to open for public ceremonies unless they are adhered to. Let us start as we intend to go on.

We rely on the good will of the stewards. We are in good hands and everyone felt safe. Our thanks to them for giving up their time.

Isn't it great to have Mass again? Even the Co op Funeral Directors commented: "it's lovely to be back in church"!

### **Mass In Nearby Churches**

<u>\*St Peter's Rushden</u> has weekend Masses but according to their website you need to message their facebook page in advance to book your place and give your details for "Track and Trace" purposes: Saturday Vigil at 6pm, Sundays at 10am. Check their website: rushdencatholicchurch.co.uk. Fr Joe tells me that the Saturday vigil Mass has space to accommodate more people.

<u>St Edwards, Kettering</u> will reopen for public Mass next Sunday (book your place via specific mobile phone, number available on St Edward's Parish website, following heating system upgrade and redecoration work in the church. Fr Gregory has done a great job, the church looks fantastic.

St Brendan's Corby have weekend Mass: 6pm Saturday and 11am Sunday.

St Patrick's, Corby reopens this week with Sunday Mass at 9am.
