The Birth of Jesus Christ in Bethlehem:

"In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be enrolled" (Lk2:1). With these words, Luke introduces his account of the birth of Jesus and explains how it came to take place in Bethlehem. A population census, for purposes of determining and collecting taxes, was what prompted Joseph to set off from Nazareth for Bethlehem, together with Mary, his betrothed, who was expecting a child. The birth of Jesus in the city of David is placed within the overarching framework of world history, even though Caesar was quite unaware of the difficult journey that these ordinary people were making on his account. And so it is that the child Jesus is born, seemingly by chance, in the place of the promise. The context in world history is important for Luke." Pope Benedict XVI

New Year's Eve & New Year's Day Indulgence:

To gain the indulgence the following conditions must be met:

- 1. Reception of Confession and Holy Communion within a brief time (that is, about twenty days).
- 2. Perform the prescribed good work, offer the: *Te Deum* on New Year's Eve / *Veni Creator Spiritus* on New Year's Day.
- 3. Pray for the Holy Father's intentions, e.g. 1 x Our Father and 1 x Hail Mary.
- 4. Be detached from sin, even venial sin.

An indulgence can be applied either to oneself or to departed souls but cannot be applied to other living persons. There are two kinds of indulgence: a "partial" indulgence removes part of the temporal punishment due for our sins whilst a "plenary" indulgence removes all of it.
