The Birth of Jesus Christ in Bethlehem:

NEW: "...She gave birth to her first-born son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths, and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn" (Luke 2:6ff). Let us begin our exegesis with the concluding words of this passage: there was no room for them in the inn. Prayerful reflection over these words has highlighted an inner parallel between this saying and the profoundly moving verse from Saint John's Prologue: "He came to his own home, and his own people received him not" (1:11). For the Saviour of the world, for him in whom all things were created (cf, Colossians 1:16), there was no room. "Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests; but the Son of man has nowhere to lay his head" (Matthew 8:20). ... "Mary wrapped the child in swaddling cloths." Without yielding to sentimentality, we may imagine with what great love Mary approached her hour and prepared for the birth of her child.

Blessed chalk will be available after each Epiphany Mass so that we might mark the year (20 24), the initials of the Magi (C M B), whose names are Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar, plus the Lord's Cross (+) on our home as a blessing. This gentle act of witness to Jesus Christ often draws questions from visitors to our home. The initials of the Magi also represent the Latin: "Christus mansionem benedicat" = "Christ bless this house".

Prayers for the Epiphany House Blessing:

The leader makes the Sign of the Cross \ and all reply: **Amen.**

The leader greets those present in the following words: Let us praise God, who fills our hearts and homes with peace. Blessed be God forever. **Blessed be God forever.**

The Word became flesh and made His dwelling place among us. It is Christ who enlightens our hearts and homes with His love. May all who enter this home find Christ's light and love. Blessed be God forever. **Blessed be God forever.**

Reader:

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way. The word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

The leader uses blessed chalk to inscribe above the front door:

20 + C + M + B + 24

As the leader inscribes the above text this can be said: "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" / "May Christ bless this house". After which Holy or Epiphany Water can be sprinkled on the door.

The leader concludes this short liturgy by making the Sign of the Cross upon themself (and others do the same) and saying: May Christ Jesus ♣ dwell with us, keep us from all harm, and make us one in mind and heart, now and forever. Amen.

The observance of the Epiphany and the Baptism of the Lord remind us of our own Holy Baptism; thus, it is suggested by the Diocese that we have a stoup at the main door of our home so that we might sign ourselves with Holy Water as we enter and leave.
