Candlemass: After the recent celebration of so many sacramentals we now look forward to the rituals associated with candles for The Presentation of the Lord (2nd February) and the Blessing of Throats on St Blaise's Day (3rd February)!

Mass on 16th January will also be offered at 11:00am in Seagrave House and all are welcome to attend this celebration.

Mass on 18th January will be offered at 8:30am in OLW.

This weekend - SPUC: "The Society for the Protection of Unborn Children" will be holding its **White Flower Appeal** which this year calls for the Government to close its pills-by-post abortion policy which ends the lives of precious babies and puts mothers in great physical and psychological danger.

The Sunday of the Word of God was instituted by Pope Francis in 2019 and is celebrated on the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (21st January). Its aim is to remind us that we hear the voice of God when the Scriptures are read at Mass. For this Sunday all churches across our Diocese are asked to "enthroned the Scriptures at Mass" and to encourage families and individuals to be immersed in the Sacred Word of God.

The green scapular is associated with spiritual conversion plus physical and mental well-being. The green scapular can be purchased from the OLW repository any time before 19th March.

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity begins on 18th January and ends on 25th January. As Catholics we are urged to pray for the visible unity of all believers in Jesus and thus we are reminded of the words of Pope Benedict XVI who said: "In this Week of Prayer for Unity our regret about the impossibility of sharing the same Eucharistic banquet - a sign that we are still far from achieving that unity for which Christ prayed - is particularly acute. This sorrowful experience, which also gives our prayers a penitential dimension, must become the reason for an even more generous dedication on the part of all so that, once the obstacles that stand in the way of full communion have been removed, the day will come when we can gather round the table of the Lord..." (19th January 2011). We most especially pray for the Rev'd Scott McCarthy, the new Presbyterian Minister in Corby, and we offer him a very warm welcome to our community and assure him of our prayers. ✠ Fr Christopher was pleased to be able to represent our two parishes at the recent Service of Introduction for Rev'd Scott.

2024 Year of Prayer / 2025 Jubilee Year:

Pope Francis asked that in 2023 we all study the documents of the Second Vatican Council and that 2024 be a Year of Prayer in preparation for the Jubilee Year of 2025. This is what the Holy Father had to say about this Year of Prayer: "In a word, may it be an intense year of prayer in which hearts are opened to receive the outpouring of God's grace and to make the 'Our Father', the prayer Jesus taught us, the life programme of each of his disciples." The Jubilee Year is a special time of grace in which the Church offers the possibility of obtaining a plenary indulgence, that is, the full or partial removal of the temporal punishment associated with sin so that no further expiation in Purgatory is required; this can be either for oneself or for the departed. More details will follow soon in the newsletter.
