New - Pope Francis: "Devoting a specific Sunday of the liturgical year to the word of God can enable the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of his word and enables us to proclaim its unfathomable riches before the world." On 8th September 1840, the Feast of the Birthday of Our Lady, Mary appeared to Sr Justine Bisqueyburo and it was revealed that the world was being called to a deeper love of the Mother of God and her Immaculate Heart. Our Lady urged those who wear the green scapular to say each day: "Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us now and at the hour of our death. Amen." The green scapular is most associated with spiritual conversion of oneself (or the person for whom one prays) plus physical and mental well-being. The green scapular can be **purchased** for 75p from the OLW repository any time before 19th March.

2024 Year of Prayer / 2025 Jubilee Year:

Pope Francis asked that in 2023 we all study the documents of the Second Vatican Council and that 2024 be a Year of Prayer in preparation for the Jubilee Year of 2025. This is what Pope Francis had to say about this Year of Prayer: "In a word, may it be an intense year of prayer in which hearts are opened to receive the outpouring of God's grace and to make the 'Our Father', the prayer Jesus taught us, the life programme of each of his disciples." The Jubilee Year is a special time of grace in which the Church offers the possibility of obtaining a plenary indulgence, that is, the full or partial removal of the temporal punishment associated with sin so that no further expiation in Purgatory is required; this can be for oneself or the departed.

Following the recent celebration of several sacramentals we now look forward to the **rituals associated with candles** for the Blessing of Throats on St Blaise's Day (3rd February) and The Presentation of the Lord (2nd February); on the latter we hope to give everyone at Mass a blessed candle to take home.

This Weekend Fr Christopher is presiding at the Sunday Masses in St Brendan's Church; we assure Canon Mark of our prayers as he has a few days away for some well-earned rest.

Next Weekend there will be an appeal and a second collection for **Lepra**. Your support of this charity, on what is World Leprosy Day, will help them continue to detect and treat over 35,000 people every year and to reach over 2.4 million people with vital health information and education. The charity seeks to provide better detection, treatment and support mechanisms, to advocate for those without a voice, to challenge prejudice wherever it exists and to build a future free from this terrible disease. The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity began on 18th January and ends on 25th January. From Pope Francis: "In these days, all Christ's followers are asked to pray in a particular way to the Father for the gift of unity, in order to proclaim the Gospel to a world torn by conflict and division. Our response to discord and division must first and foremost be to pray for the healing and reconciliation that Christ won for us by his saving Passion. We are called to share in Jesus' own prayer at the Last Supper 'that all may be one... so that the world may believe' (John 17:21) and find salvation." (20/02/2021)
