**"On the journey home**, something unexpected happens. Jesus does not travel with the others but stays behind in Jerusalem. His parents become aware of this only at the end of the first day's journey. For them it was...normal to assume that Jesus was somewhere among the group of pilgrims. Luke uses the word *synodia* - "pilgrim community" - the technical term for the traveling caravan. This illustrates very beautifully that in the Holy Family freedom and obedience were combined in a healthy manner. The twelve-year-old Jesus was free to spend time with friends and children of his own age, and to remain in their company during the journey. Naturally, his parents expected to see him when evening came." Benedict XVI

→ The **Blessing of Throats** will be offered on St Blaise's Day (3<sup>rd</sup> February) during the 9:30am Mass. From the ninth century the prayers of St Blaise were invoked for ailments of the throat and by the fifteenth century the blessing of throats using candles was well established. Such rituals lift our heart to God and often we realise that something extraordinary has happened. The red ribbon tied around the candles represents martyrdom and the "X" shape of the candles is symbolic of the martyrdom of St Andrew. *St Blaise and St Andrew: Pray for us!*

**Shrove Tuesday - 13<sup>th</sup> February:** Join our clergy team for Mass on this day, which is the last day of Ordinary Time, and then adjourn to the Parish Room for tea/coffee and pancakes before we begin the Lenten Fast! All are welcome.

## Code of Canon Law - Canon 919:

§1. A person who is to receive the **Most Holy Eucharist** is to abstain for at least one hour before Holy Communion from any food and drink, except for only water and medicine.

*[NB: §2. Relates to Priests celebrating multiple Masses]*

§3. The elderly, the infirm, and those who care for them can receive the **Most Holy Eucharist** even if they have eaten something within the preceding hour.
