The following major documents can all be found online: Sacrosanctum Concilium The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy / Lumen Gentium Light of the Nations / Dei Verbum The Word of God / Gaudium et spes The Church in the Modern World.
- **2024** we observe an intense **period of prayer**. Perhaps you might join us for Eucharistic Exposition as a concrete way of fulfilling this papal request? See the calendar for details.
- 2025 we observe a Jubilee Year? In the Jubilee Year we shall also celebrate the 175th Anniversary of the Restoration, by Pope Pius IX in 1850, of the Catholic Hierarchy in England and Wales. This is part of what St John Henry Newman said in his Second Spring homily at St Mary's College, Oscott in 1852: "Westminster and Nottingham, Beverley and Hexham, Northampton and Shrewsbury, if the world lasts, shall be names as musical to the ear, as stirring to the heart, as the glories we have lost; and Saints shall rise out of them...".

Re:New • In 2008, Jimmy Mizen was murdered whilst in a bakery with his brother in South London. Amazingly, Jimmy's parents, Margaret and Barry, immediately forgave their son's killer. On Saturday, 2nd March between 10:00am and 12:00noon Margaret and Barry will visit the St Thomas Centre, Northampton Cathedral to share their story of compassion. All welcome.

Question: When reading the Creed, I noticed these words in red type: "At the words that follow, up to and including 'and became man', all bow." Why do we all bow at these words?

Answer: Well spotted! The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM, #137) declares that all people are meant to make a profound bow of the body at the praying of: "by the power of the Holy Spirit he was born of the Virgin Mary, and became man". In addition, on the Solemnities of the Annunciation and the Lord's Nativity (Christmas) rather than bow everyone genuflects. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "Belief in the true Incarnation of the Son of God is the distinctive sign of Christian faith" (# 463). The Incarnation is a central event of our salvation for without taking on our sinful human nature, Christ could not have redeemed us through His obedience to the Father in His sacrificial act of love on the Holy Cross. Thus, Jesus took on our nature to heal humanity from within. As a way of highlighting this awesome mystery of our Catholic Faith, we bow (or genuflect on the above days) during this creedal phrase to expresses this pivotal Christian belief. NB: The General Instruction of the Roman Missal and the Catechism of the Catholic Church are available online.

Shrove Tuesday (13th February): Join all our clergy for Holy Mass on this day, which is the last day of Ordinary Time, and then come to the Parish Room for tea/coffee and delicious pancakes before we begin the great Fast of Lent! All welcome.
