The miniature **St Joseph's Cincture** sacramental will be celebrated on **Wednesday**, **1**st **May** at Holy Mass: The Memorial of St Joseph the Worker


The St Joseph's Cincture is likened to the cincture worn by a Priest, by monks and nuns plus Consecrated Virgins as a sign of their call to chastity. → The miniature St Joseph's Cincture is carried in a pocket or

placed before a statue of St Joseph at home. To undertake this devotion a person must daily offer one "Glory be..." on each of the 'knots' of the cincture while pondering St Joseph's seven:

Sorrows: 1: The doubt of Saint Joseph - Matthew 1:19.

- 2: The poverty of Jesus' birth Luke 2:7.
- 3: The Circumcision Luke 2:21.
- 4: Simeon's prophecy that many would be lost Luke 2:34.
- 5: The flight into Egypt Matthew 2:14.
- 6: The return from Egypt Matthew 2:22.
- 7: The loss of the Child Jesus Luke 2:45.
- **Joys:** 1: The Message of the Angel Matthew 1:20.
 - 2: The Birth of Jesus Luke 2:7.
 - 3: The Most Holy Name of Jesus Matthew 1:25.
 - 4: Simeon's prophecy that many would be rise Luke 2:34.
 - 5: The Overthrow of idols Isaiah 19:1.
 - 6: Life with Mary and Jesus Luke 2:39.
 - 7: Finding Jesus in the Temple Luke 2:46.

Tuesday is ST GEORGE'S DAY!

We assure people from the following of our prayers as we honour our national patron saint: England, Venice, Portugal, Ethiopia, Georgia, etc.! St George is the patron saint of Lebanese, Syrian and Palestinian Christians plus he is also honoured by Latin and Syro-Malabar Catholics in Kerala. George was born to a Christian family in Cappadocia around 280 and after moving to Palestine he joined the army of Diocletian. When in



303 the Emperor of Rome issued the edict of persecution against Christians, St George gave his belongings to the poor and in front of Diocletian tore the document apart and professed his faith in Jesus; for this he suffered terrible torture and was beheaded. After his death, a basilica was erected over the place of his burial and his relics are still visible to this today. St George: Pray for us.
