Walsingham: On 19th August AD 1934, Cardinal Bourne of Westminster and Bishop Lawrence of Northampton led the great pilgrimage of Bishops and 10,000 pilgrims to Walsingham; there the Slipper Chapel was declared to be the National Shrine to Our Lady for Catholics in England. Thus, let us give thanks to God for all that has taken place in "England's Nazareth" over those ninety years and for all who visit the Shrine in this its anniversary year.

2. For any man who feels a calling to the Permanent Diaconate you are asked to visit St Mary's Catholic Church in Dunstable on Saturday, 8th June from 10:00am-12:00noon to explore this further. Please let Fr Christopher know if you are attending.
3. If you feel a call to the Sacred Priesthood do discuss this with Fr Christopher or Fr Wayne who will be keen to offer support.
4. If you (male or female) feel a call to the Religious Life, please discuss this with the clergy who will be keen to offer support.

The liturgical reforms of Vatican II affirmed the dignity of every Baptised person whose task in the world is to sanctify it by living as a Priest, Prophet and Monarch. In worship the Baptised come before God, as His child, but also as someone united to Him through the Sacraments of Initiation: Holy Baptism, Confirmation and the Holy Eucharist. Thus, the call of the Second Vatican Council was that all the Baptised should play an active, full and conscious part in the sacred liturgy through offering the **responses**, by **singing** and making the various **liturgical gestures** (e.g. striking our chest during the Confiteor, the three-fold cross at the Gospel, bowing during the Creed, etc). In these three ways our Catholic Faith is nourished and renewed. However, when we choose not to participate fully in the sacred offering of the Mass then our worship is impoverished, we give God less than His right to expect, and we become spectators to what is taking place in the sanctuary rather than participants in the Eucharistic Sacrifice.

The lectionary - the **book of Holy Scripture readings** - for Mass and the Sacraments, is changing as part of a continuing process of revising all liturgical texts; this began with the Roman Missal in 2011 when the conclusion to the First & Second Reading changed to: "**The word of the Lord**". The lectionary will use the English Standard Version (Catholic Edition) of the Holy Bible and the Abbey Psalter. It will be mandatory to use this from Advent 2024. A training day for the new lectionary is being held in Luton on Tuesday, 11th June and all responsible for delivering the liturgy are invited: Readers, cantors, musicians, catechists, etc. Please contact Maggie if you would like to participate in the training day.
